Introduction

The Hong Kong Institute of Landscape Architects (HKILA), through The Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA), commissioned The Centre for Communication and Public Opinion Survey of The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CCPOS) in May 2015 to conduct a questionnaire survey collecting members' opinions on "Method for Selecting the Chief Executive by Universal Suffrage".

Methodology

The questionnaire contained 2 questions. The data collection period was between 19 May and 3 June 2015. A total of 340 questionnaires were sent out and **94 completed questionnaires** were finally received, with response rate of **28% (27.6%)**.

The survey was conducted on CCPOS's online survey platform. CCPOS generated individual questionnaire hyperlinks and they were subsequently sent by HKILA through email to their members. Each HKILA member would receive a hyperlink and could only submit the questionnaire once.

This was an anonymous survey since the hyperlinks were sent by HKILA but the completed questionnaires were submitted to CCPOS's server, both HKILA and CCPOS could not identify respondents.

Results

Q.1 *What do you consider the Government's Proposal on the Method for Selecting the Chief Executive by Universal Suffrage announced on 22 April 2015?*

80% (79.8%) of the respondents did not accept the Government's Proposal on the Method for Selecting the Chief Executive by Universal Suffrage announced on 22 April 2015. 17% accepted. 3% (3.2%) indicated no comment.

Q.2 *Your year of admission to a fully qualified professional membership of HKILA?*

71% (71.3%) of the respondents were admitted as the fully qualified professional members of HKILA between 2005 and 2015 (Inclusive). 13% (12.8%) of the respondents were admitted between 1995 and 2004 (Inclusive). 12% (11.7%) were between 1985 and 1994 (Inclusive). 2% (2.1%) were admitted before 1985. 2% (2.1%) did not answer this question.

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
